

- 4. accept responsibility for all financial obligations to the Commonwealth incurred by my relatives that arise out of their stay in Australia.
- 5. accept responsibility for compliance by my relatives with all relevant legislation and awards in relation to any employment entered into by my relatives in Australia.
- 6. accept responsibility for compliance by my relatives with the conditions under which they are allowed to enter Australia (unless the Minister decides otherwise).
- 7. inform the department in writing if I withdraw my support for my relative/s before this application is finalised

I understand that a person who intentionally makes a false statement in a statutory declaration is guilty of an offence under section 11 of the *Statutory Declarations Act* 1959, and I believe that the statements in this declaration are true in every particular.



Note 1 A person who intentionally makes a false statement in a statutory declaration is guilty of an offence, the punishment for which is imprisonment for a term of 4 years — see section 11 of the Statutory Declarations Act 1959.

Note 2 Chapter 2 of the Criminal Code applies to all offences against the Statutory Declarations Act 1959 — see section 5A of the Statutory Declarations Act 1959.

Bank officer with 5 or more continuous years of service
