



"Commitment to South Australia" Declaration

(for General Skilled Migration 190 and 491 visa applications)

Understanding your visa conditions

You must be aware of and adhere to your visa conditions. Failure to do so may result in visa cancellation by the Department of Home Affairs and could affect future visa applications.

Skilled Work Regional (Provisional) visa holders (including accompanying family members) must live, work and study only in a designated regional area for the duration of their visa. The whole of South Australia is designated as regional for migration purposes.

Commitment to South Australia

State nomination is provided to meet the skills needs of South Australia and is granted on the basis of your genuine interest and commitment to living and working in South Australia with a view to long-term settlement in the state.

The Commitment to South Australia is a mutual commitment with the Government of South Australia. The state government's commitment to you is demonstrated through the decision to nominate you, and the provision of a range of services and programs to welcome and support new arrivals.

In applying for a South Australian nomination, you acknowledge to demonstrate your genuine commitment to South Australian by:

- 1. Intending to live, work and study in South Australia with a view to long-term settlement in South Australia.
 - Your commitment to South Australia commences from the date of arrival for settlement.
 - For those already living in South Australia, your commitment to South Australia commences from statenominated visa grant date.
- 2. Understanding the costs associated with settling in South Australia and have sufficient financial resources to support yourself and your family. The Government of South Australia does not provide financial assistance for the costs of settlement.
- 3. Registering your arrival in South Australia via Immigration SA's Apply Website, and completing regular online surveys as requested.
- 4. Understanding that Immigration SA provides a range of services to assist with job search and settlement, for primary and skilled secondary applicants. These services are available to you for two years from your arrival or grant date.
- 5. Maintaining up to date contact details through your Immigration SA Apply Website. You will need to advise of any changes to contact details within 14 calendar days of a change occurring.
- 6. Considering employment opportunities across all of South Australia, not just Adelaide. State nomination does not guarantee employment, nor is it a job offer. It is your responsibility to research job opportunities, utilise a variety of job search strategies and secure employment.
- 7. Connect with Immigration SA and access the services available if you need assistance finding employment.
